STANDARDISED PRICE LIST

All funeral directors are legally required to publish this Price List for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices to let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary).

ATTENDED FUNERAL (funeral director's charges only) £2,695

This is where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.

Taking care of all necessary legal and administrative arrangements	£1,055
Collecting and transporting the deceased person from the place of death (normally within 15 miles of the funeral director's premises) into the funeral director's care	£190
Care of the deceased person before the funeral in appropriate facilities. The deceased person will be kept at the funeral director's branch premises.	£200
Providing a suitable coffin - this will be made of an oak veneer	£599
Viewing of the deceased person for family and friends, by appointment with the funeral director (*where viewing is requested by the customer)	£1
At a date and time you agree with the funeral director, taking the deceased person direct to the agreed cemetery or crematorium (normally within 20 miles of the funeral director's premises) in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle	£650

UNATTENDED FUNERAL

This is where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person but do not attend the burial or cremation itself.

Burial (funeral director's charges only) £2,695

Cremation (funeral director's charges plus the cremation fee)² £1,695

FEES YOU MUST PAY

For an attended or unattended burial funeral, the **burial fee**.¹
In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is: **£760 - £1,128**

For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot; for an existing grave with a memorial, you may need to pay a removal/replacement fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge a number of other fees

For an attended cremation funeral, the **cremation fee**.²
In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation for local residents is: **£900 - £1,300**

ADDITIONAL FUNERAL DIRECTOR PRODUCTS AND SERVICES

The funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples include:

Additional mileage (price per mile)	£1.72
Additional transfers of the deceased person's body (e.g. to their home, to a place of worship etc.) (price per transfer)	£284
Collection and delivery of ashes	£56
Embalming	£242
Funeral officiant (e.g. celebrant, minister of religion etc.)	Prices on request
Services supplied outside of normal office hours	£145

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services, so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement or you can use a different supplier.

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for digging and closing a new grave, or for re-opening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctor's fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificates for cremation.
